Every two years, the <u>Military Family Advisory Network (MFAN)</u> fields the Military Family Support Programming Survey to understand the lived experiences of our service members, veterans, and their families. This important research provides rich insight into the support needs of military-connected families and serves as a catalyst for the creation and strengthening of programs, policies, and resources.

Real-Life Issues: The 2023 survey takes a comprehensive look at military family life, including: Childcare, Employment, Family Relationships, Financial Readiness, Food Insecurity, Health & Wellbeing, Housing, Military-to-Civilian Transition

Who is eligible? All service members, veterans, and their family members over the age of 18 may participate: Active-duty military personnel, National Guard members, Reservists, Veterans, Military Retirees, Partners/spouses (current, divorced, surviving)


# **MSU Texas Dental Hygiene Clinic to offer free teeth cleanings for kids**
